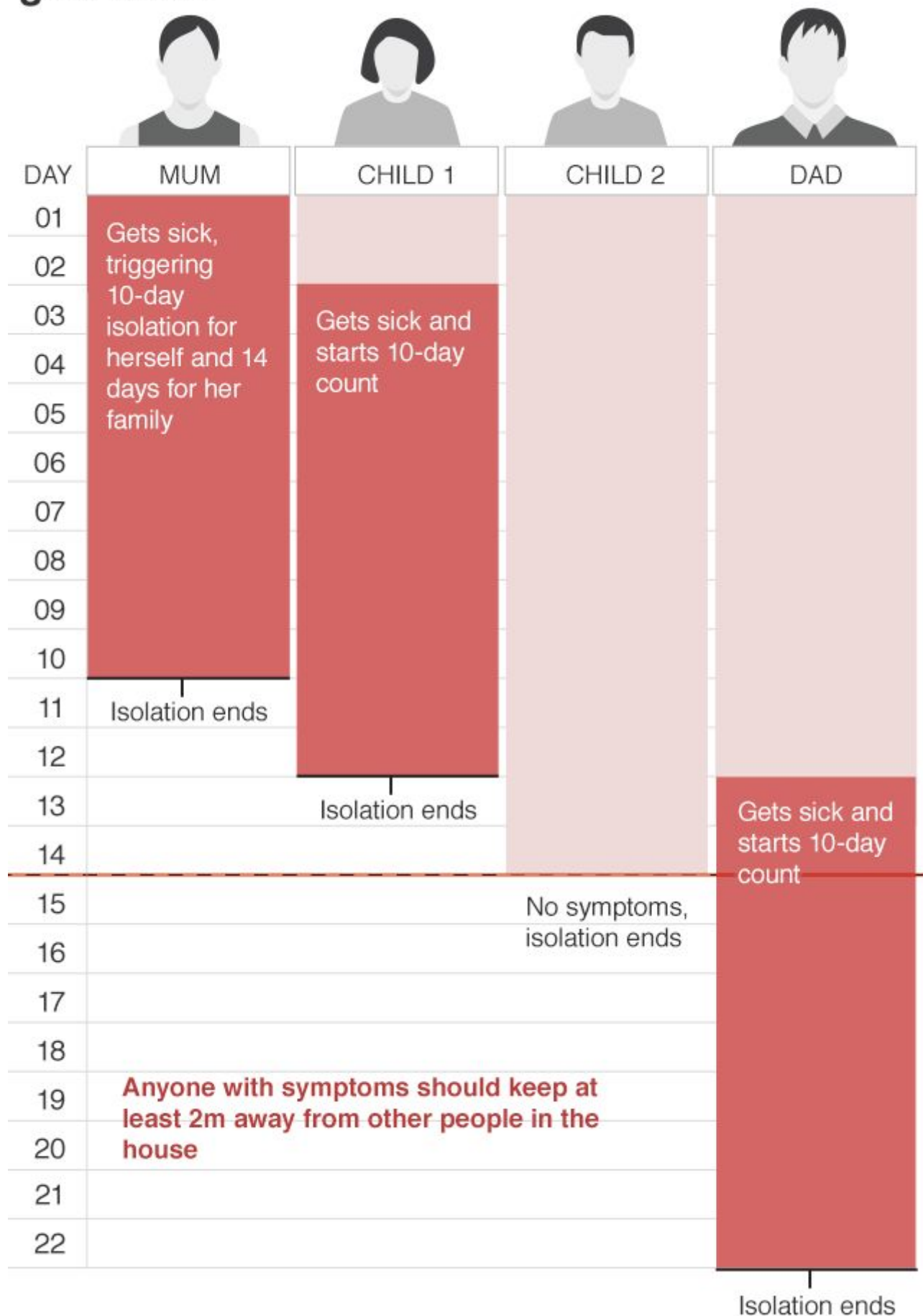
Coronavirus related absences Reference Guide

| What to do if... | Action needed | Return to School when... |

| ...my child has coronavirus symptoms <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A high temperature • A new, continuous cough – this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours • A loss or change to your sense of smell or taste | Do not come to school Contact school regularly Self isolate Get a test Inform school immediately about test result | ...the test comes back negative. |
| ...my child is unwell but is not displaying any of the coronavirus symptoms above | Take the usual action for an unwell child Inform the School Monitor the symptoms | ...your child is well enough to. |
| ...my child tests positive for coronavirus | Do not come to school Inform school immediately about test result Contact school regularly Unwell child to self isolate for at least 10 days - other household members to self-isolate for 14 days | ...they feel better. They can return to school after 10 days even if they have a cough or loss of taste/smell. These symptoms can last several weeks once the infection has gone. |
| ...somebody in my household * has coronavirus symptoms | Do not come to school Contact school regularly Self isolate Household member to get a test Inform school immediately about test result | ...the household member test is negative. |
| ...somebody in my household * has tested positive for coronavirus | Do not come to school Contact school regularly Self isolate for 14 days | ...the child has completed 14 days of self-isolation and is not displaying symptoms. |
| ...NHS test and trace have identified my child as 'close contact' of somebody with confirmed coronavirus | Do not come to school Contact school regularly Self isolate for 14 days | ...the child has completed 14 days of self-isolation and is not displaying symptoms. . |
| ...we/my child has travelled and has to self-isolate as part of a period of quarantine | Do not take unauthorised leave in term time Consider quarantine requirements and FCO advice when booking travel Provide information to school as per attendance policy Do not come to school Contact school regularly Self isolate for 14 days | ...the quarantine period of 14 days has been completed. |
| ...we have received medical advice that my child must resume shielding | Do not come to school Contact school as required by the pastoral team Shield until you are informed that restrictions are lifted and shielding is paused again | ...school informs you that restrictions have been lifted and your child can return to school again. |

* The Boarding House is separated into two households - girls and boys. Therefore, if one of the boarders in a household has coronavirus symptoms, it is possible that other members of the household, including some residential staff, will need to self-isolate. This may mean children will need to return home whilst awaiting the results of the symptomatic child/adult.

If the symptomatic child/adult provides a negative test, the pupils and staff affected can immediately return to school, unless they develop symptoms. If a positive test is provided, we will make contact with the Health Protection Team at PHE and follow the necessary advice. This may result in other members of the school community having to self-isolate for 14 days.
